About Chelsea Academy

Our School: Chelsea Academy, a coeducational Catholic Liberal Arts and college preparatory school, was founded in 2008. The school offers a rigorous curriculum as well as extracurricular programs in art, music, drama, athletics, and outdoor adventure. Our first senior class graduated in May 2012.

Community: Located in Virginia's Shenandoah Valley, Chelsea serves families from eight neighboring counties as well as students from Asia and Europe. Students and their families come from a broad range of educational and socioeconomic backgrounds. The school welcomes students of all beliefs. While not all Chelsea students are Catholic, all students learn about the Catholic faith.

Student Body: There are currently 225 students in grades K-12, including 84 students in the Upper School. There are 15 students in the class of 2025.

Faculty: The Chelsea faculty is comprised of 22 full-time and 9 part-time faculty members.

Accreditation: Chelsea is accredited by the Virginia Independent School Association.

Our Mission

Chelsea Academy seeks to form confident young men and women educated in the liberal arts tradition and the Catholic faith. Chelsea is committed to promoting and cultivating in its students the life of the mind and a love of truth; an appreciation for the natural world and the heritage of human achievement; enduring friendships; a spirit of adventure; and the virtues of honesty, charity, diligence, courage, and personal responsibility. Through an ethos shaped by Catholic teaching and devotions and a balanced curriculum that includes the humanities, math, science, athletics, and the arts, Chelsea helps students grow into young adults committed to and capable of making positive contributions to their families, places of work, and communities.

Curriculum

Chelsea offers a Catholic Liberal Arts and college-preparatory curriculum. Small classes and the course sequence, featuring an integrated study of the humanities, lend themselves to cross-curricular research, active student participation, and close collaboration among students and teachers. Students may take honors courses in English, history, science, Latin and French.

Graduation Requirements

- Four years of English, incorporating grammar, composition, and classical literature
- Four years of mathematics, featuring algebra I, geometry, algebra II, pre-calculus, and calculus
- Four years of history, covering ancient Greece and Rome, medieval and modern Europe, and the United States.
- Four years of science, including physical science, biology, chemistry, and physics
- Four years of theology, including Sacred Scripture, Sacred Tradition, ethics and apologetics, the Church and modernity, and an introduction into elements of philosophy
- Three years of Latin, French, or a combination of the two, including second-year proficiency in either language
- One year of U.S. Government
- One year of fine arts, with options including studio art, schola cantorum, and drama
- Senior thesis and presentation

Grading, GPA, and Class Rank

Chelsea's grading system is designed to reflect student achievement; the school actively resists the tendency towards grade inflation. We serve students with a range of interests and abilities. Our small size and 1:10 faculty-student ratio enable us to challenge those students who are able to progress more quickly and to provide individualized academic reinforcement to those students who need it.

Chelsea operates on a two-semester system with cumulative semester and final exams in December and May. Grades are scored on a ten-point scale: A (93-100), A- (90-92), B+ (87-89), B (83-86), B- (80-82), C+ (77-79), C (73-76), C- (70-72), D+ (67-69), D (63-66), D- (60-62), F (0-59).

Grade Point Averages have been calculated on a 4.0 unweighted scale. Chelsea offers honors courses in English, history, science, and foreign languages (at level IV or higher). Beginning in 2022-2023, honors courses are no longer offered in math.

The honors classes have been weighted with an extra half point added to the GPA. GPAs are calculated at the end of each semester and averaged at the end of each year.

Senior Thesis

All seniors write a thesis that is the capstone of each student's intellectual development at Chelsea Academy. The thesis is a substantial research paper that explores a question built upon the close reading of a Great Book; a question in history, literature, theology, philosophy, science, mathematics, or another approved subject area. Each student chooses a faculty advisor to participate in the reading of the chosen book. The project culminates in a formal oral presentation among faculty, peers, and parents. Recent topics included: analyzing Thomas Hobbes' *Leviathan* and the role of government; the controversy surrounding Charles Darwin's *On the Origin of Species*; family and society in *King Lear*; revisiting Booker T. Washington's views on racism in *Up from Slavery*; William Shakespeare's Catholic roots on display in *The Winter's Tale*; and an analysis of C.S. Lewis' theology in *The Chronicles of Narnia*.
